- Discuss ideas
- Ask our Visitor Experience Team questions

Please respect other visitors and ensure your group does not:

- Touch the artworks or plinths (the boxes artwork sometimes sit on)
- Run or shout in the galleries
- Step or lean over barriers
- Eat or drink in the galleries
- Touch the plants or step in the planting beds in the garden.

Other guidelines:

- Photography, without flash, is allowed in all of the exhibitions.
- Public toilets are situated on the ground floor and in the Learning Studios.
- In the event of a fire alarm all visitors will be directed to a fire exit and external assembly point by THW staff. Keep a register on-hand to check your group. Once evacuated you must follow the guidance of our staff.

Materials:

- We encourage you to draw and create in the galleries using pencils, paper and sketchbooks (A3 or smaller).
- To protect the artworks we do not allow wet materials and sharp tools such as pens, paints, oil pastels and scissors.
